Online gaming and screen time

This year we focused on online gaming and how to make sure children stay safe when they go online. With so many ways to play games online and so many games to choose from, it might be useful to have some additional sources of advice to help guide and advise you. This year Roblox has become popular with primary-aged children, who can now design and upload their own games, as well as play other games in a multiplayer environment, and Minecraft continues to lead many children towards Youtube to find out how to play it!

Many of these games have built-in chat functions, which enable gamers to communicate with other players

from all over the world. An element for parents and carers to consider is the age ratings of games. PEGI (the Pan European Games Information system) created an appropriate age rating system, similar to the film industry, which helps to determine what is suitable for your child. It is extremely vital for parents and carers to first check the content of any gaming that your child may engage with.



So, how can gaming be more controlled and, where appropriate, be supervised?

Firstly, parents should find out about the game itself. Common Sense Media provide independent age-based ratings and reviews for games, apps, movies, TV shows, websites, books and music to help families understand their content.

Another source of advice is internetmatters.org - an organisation which aims

to help children keep safe in the digital world. Screen time has become a significant concern and families are struggling to determine how much time is healthy for their children to spend in front of a screen.

As all schools, we are now teaching a generation of learners who are growing up in a digital world. Although this has many advantages, there are also numerous drawbacks. Children

can get overstimulated by excessive screen time and this, in turn, has an effect on their learning in a traditional school environment.

We strongly advise that parents monitor online activity and help their child keep a 'screen diary' where possible so that the amount of time spent in front of the screen is tracked and the type of activity they are engaging with. Parents must understand the potential impacts of increased

online social engagement upon their child's development and prioritise creative unplugged playtime particularly for younger children.

We are particularly proud of this award as it truly reflects our ethos and underpins everything we do, placing the child at the centre of all of our work. We firmly believe that by working towards the next level of this award, the children have become more respectful, have a strong sense of right and justice, not only for themselves, but also for the global community and have become more independent and mature learners understanding that in respecting children's rights they have certain responsibilities to bear.

HOW ARE RIGHTS TAUGHT?

The Rights Respecting ethos which underpins our practice is presented to the children in a number of ways as a majority of the work that is done in class is cross curricular. This in turn promotes not only the Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) but other subject areas as part of the National Curriculum. Research has shown that when children are taught in school about their rights and responsibilities under the CRC, they are more respecting of the rights of others. Children who have learnt about their rights and responsibilities have:

- a better understanding of what it means to have rights and responsibilities
- a more positive attitude to school
- better relationships with their classmates and teachers
- higher self-esteem and confidence
- an increased awareness of how to be a global citizen



OUR STEERING GROUP

We have a Rights Respecting Steering Group which consists of a cross-section of school staff, parents and governors that is responsible for the promotion of the CRC across the school. The Steering Group has organised a number of different initiatives and events including the development of the new Lunchtime Charter, school-wide displays and fundraisers such as our Diversity Carnival.

PUPIL LEADERS

Our UNICEF Pupil Leaders recently made an incredible presentation about our journey as a Rights Respecting School to leaders from Birmingham City Council, representatives from UNICEF, local Headteachers and school leaders. They were articulate about the impact that it has made on achievement and excellence at Adderley. In future newsletters and editions of the Adderley Voice we will continue to share our journey to gaining Level 1 status with you.

The best part was when we made delicious and yummy stir-fry noodles with our friends.








Where does snow go?

Natural History Museum

Year 2 were extremely lucky to visit London last half-term as part of our topic 'Wriggle & Crawl'! We visited the Natural History Museum, one of London's most beautiful landmarks. The children went on a minibeast trail looking at hundreds of specimen. They discovered their habitats and what their diet was (some arthropods eat socks!). Then they chose their favourite minibeast to write about at school.

Did you know?

- Butterflies can taste with their feet and choose the yummiest leaves to lay their eggs on, as that will be their caterpillar's food.

- A housefly beats its wings 200 times a second!
- Most snails have four tentacles two for seeing and two for feeling and smelling.

us from our school gates to the local area. We had a lot of fun drawing the route and writing about the different landmarks we could see on our way to the classroom.



YEAR 3

As part of our Cornerstones Curriculum, Year 3 have been learning all about the Stone Age in our topic 'Tribal Tales'. For this, we visited the Bishops Wood Centre where we were able to experience

what it would be like to live in Stone Age time

Once we had caught our dinner, we needed to

learn how to make a fire so that we could cook it and keep warm. We used flint and sticks together to start the fire and then sat around it in a circle to cook our food and keep it warm. We also made a fence out of willow to keep predators away.

> The trip was very informative and helped us to learn what life was like in pre-historic Britain. We learnt all about different types of rocks and even got to create our own cave paintings! This linked in very well with our Science topic as we have been investigating the strengths and uses of different rocks.

As soon as we arrived, we were all excited and eager. Even though it was freezing, we did not let the weather ruin our day. First we learnt how the Stone Age people caught their food so we had to go hunting for animals and gather berries. We used sticks to aim for the animals and created fishing nets to catch some fish. Did you know Stone Age people didn't have any shops?

> Soon after, we had to create a shelter using large sticks, string and a huge mammoth skin. We worked as a team to create a shelter that would keep us warm and dry. We had lots of fun working as a team. Our host said we were the best school at showing team work, our teachers were very pleased!

In Art and Design, we have explored the patterns and paintings the Stone Age people used to communicate. Creating our own cave painting was so much fun! As well as this, we used natural materials (pomegranate) to make our own fabric dye and colour our cotton fabric, just like they used to in the Stone Age!



Year 3 also had a Parent Workshop about reading and homework. Parents were invited to take part in some reading and homework activities in order to learn some strategies which they could help their children with at home. In the workshop, there was a comprehension table with questions to help children with their understanding. Moreover, strategies on how to complete the children's Home Reading Journal and support spellings at home were also discussed. We would like to thank the parents/ guardians again for attending





As part of our links with King Edwards School, four children from Year Six were invited to take part in the Littlehist History Quiz at Camp Hill Campus.



WORLD BOOK DAY



Healthy Lunchboxes

Adderley Primary believes in providing all pupils with a healthy nutritious lifestyle. As part of our Be Healthy Schools award Adderley wants to work with parents to ensure pupils lunchboxes are healthly and providing all the nutrients required for a hard days learning.

Preparing your child's lunchbox

A healthier lunchbox should:

- Be based on starchy carbohydrates (bread, potatoes, rice, pasta)
- Include fresh fruit and vegetables / salad
- Include a soure of protein such as beans and pulses, eggs, fish, meat, cheese (or dairy alternative)
- Include a side dish such as low-fat and lower sugar youghurt (or dairy alternative), tea cake, fruit bread, plain rice / corn cakes, homemade plain popcorn, sugar-free jelly
