CORONAVIRUS ADVICE

Dear Parent/Carers,

Please can all parents/carers ensure that the school has the correct contact details. It is vital that you keep the school informed of any changes in contact numbers or addresses. During these unprecedented times it is even more vital that parents keep communication lines open with the school in case of emergencies or class closures. Please inform the school immediately if your family is required to self-isolate due to contact with Coronavirus. Remember, do not send your child or children into school if any members of your family are being tested for Coronavirus.

It is also really important that everyone respects the measures school has introduced to keep everyone safe. Please ensure that all families continue to follow advice.

- Wash hands: keep washing your hands regularly for 20 seconds.
- Cover face: wear a face covering in enclosed spaces.
- Let the fresh air in your homes, open windows for short, sharp bursts of 10 to 15 minutes regularly throughout the day.
- Make space: stay at least 2 metres apart - or 1 metre with a face covering or other precautions.
- In Birmingham you must not socialise with anybody outside of your household or support bubble in any indoor setting, whether at home or in a public place.
