Curriculum Information

What your child is learning this half term:

Autumn 1: Scrumdiddlyumptious

English

Our curriculum this half term will be focusing on writing a recount on our visit to Cadbury World. Children will also be writing a setting description focusing on the Chocolate Room in Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. We will be focusing on this story throughout our lessons and the children will also be watching the film!

At home, ensure that your child knows all of their common exception words and ensure that you read lots of different stories with your child.



RMSE

Children will be exploring the key question 'Would celebrating Diwali at home and in the community bring a feeling of belonging to a Hindu child?' Throughout a series of lessons children will explore the festival of Diwali which will then allow them to develop their understanding to answer the key questions.

At home, discuss with your child the festival of Diwali and what they know about the festival.

Educational Visits

Maths

This half term, we will be building on the children's understanding of place value and two of the key number operations; addition and subtraction. We will also be incorporating reasoning and problem solving within the lessons. Children will continue to develop their Mental Arithmetic and Times Tables through weekly focuses.

At home, ensure that your child is regularly practising their times tables.



Physical Education

PE this term is focusing on three areas. Children will discuss the importance of Football, Gymnastics and Tennis. In Football and Tennis children will be learning basic principles of the game. In Gymnastics, children will be creating sequences using different movements. PE takes place on a Monday and all children must come to school in their PE kit.

At home: Practise skills and read around the activity that your child is learning this half term.



Art/DT

In Art, children will be looking at the work of Jeremy Scott and re-creating his piece of work. They will use a range of media to recreate still life compositions of fruit as well using their design skills to create a new chocolate wrapper for different chocolates. In Design Technology, children will be making cheesecakes, chocolate slime and chocolate cracknell.

At home encourage your child to explore various materials and use these to create things

Homework

Children are given weekly Maths and English tasks to complete online on Purple Mash. Homework is set on Thursday and due in on Tuesday. Those that have no access to a device will be given weekly activities in their homework book. ILP will be given as half-termly tasks where children will be given a project linked to the ILP topic. Home reader books are changed weekly, it is also important for children to read at home and write at least two comments in their planner



Science

Our topic for this term is Animals including Humans. Children will explore the different food groups, importance of nutrients and learning about healthy eating. They will also identify parts of the skeletons and examine how muscles work.

At home, you could support your child by taking them to a supermarket and discussing healthy options of food.

Computing

'We Are Programmers'

The focus for this term is programming. Children will be recapping the importance of internet safety. They will learn about animation and use the software Scratch to animate their characters.

At home, you can support your child by accessing Scratch online and allowing them to explore and discover.

History

In History this term, children will be using secondary resources to research John Cadbury and explore the history of Cadbury.

At home, take your child to the library and allow them to explore the history of chocolate and identify where food comes from.

Geography

In Geography, children will match the food they eat to the countries they come from and will also learn about Fair Trade sourcing.

At home, take your child to a Supermarket and allow them to explore different Fair trade products.
