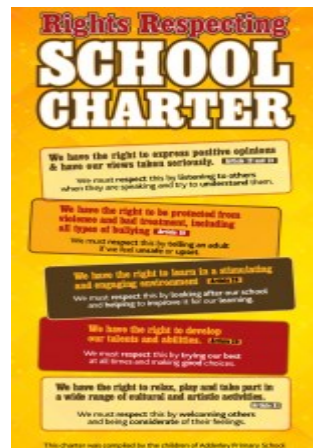

Adderley Primary School Positive Pupil Behaviour Policy

At Adderley Primary School, we aim to create a calm, caring, safe environment in which pupils can work towards achieving their full potential. Our Positive Pupil Behaviour Policy has been developed in line with the articles in the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child. The school has updated the Positive Pupil Behaviour Policy to reflect the views and opinions of our pupils.

Pupils Aims and Responsibilities

- To show high levels of respect consistently towards peers, parents, staff and school environment.
- Pupils acknowledge commonalities and celebrate differences, feel valued and nurtured.
- Pupils to take full responsibility for their own behaviour, learning and to consistently work hard. Pupils must strive to achieve their best to reach their full potential.
- To be fully aware of their rights, responsibilities and contribute to produce their Class Charters. Pupils are empowered and have zero tolerance of bullying, harassment and violence.
- To follow school/class/lunchtime charters at all times.
- To be aware of the rewards and sanctions relating to behaviour.
- To develop empathy and understanding towards others and recognise that we all have rights.
- To be able to consistently make a positive contribution to the school environment and community.



Parents also need to support their children's behaviour and attitude towards school life by following the aims and responsibilities below.

Parent Aims and Responsibilities

- To work in partnership with the school to promote positive values and Rights Respecting behaviour.
- To encourage their children to take responsibility for their actions.
- To value the work of the school, be aware of the school vision and the school's Positive Pupil Behaviour Policy.
- To support their children with their learning at home.
- To attend Parents' Afternoons, Curriculum Workshops, Open Days and other events designed to support their children.
- To be proactive and take responsibility for their child's behaviour.
- Inform the school of any changes in circumstances that may affect their child's behaviour.
- Discuss any behavioural concerns with the class teacher promptly.
- To be aware of the events taking place in school via the newsletter and website.
- Parents will communicate with their child's class teacher for any information.
- Sharing or raising of any behaviour concerns. All school staff should refer to the Parent Communication Chart when behaviour concerns are raised.

If parents have any concerns regarding their child's behaviour, they should speak to the class teacher initially, allow them to investigate the concerns and share feedback accordingly.

Rewards and Sanctions

Rewards

- ◆ Positive verbal praise - this is given consistently and on-going.
- ◆ House Points - there are given consistently and on-going.
- ◆ Special Head Teacher sticker award - given for outstanding work, exceptional behaviour and attitudes.
- Head Teacher certificates.
- ◆ Half termly afternoon tea with the Head Teacher.
- ◆ End of term cinema treat with the Head Teacher.
- ◆ Special Deputy Head Teacher stickers and certificates.
- ◆ Assistant Head Teacher stickers and certificates.
- ◆ Teacher certificates.
- ◆ Extra break.
- ◆ Golden ticket.
- ◆ Adderley Gold Tokens to be exchanged in the Social Enterprise Hub.
- ◆ Cinema and DVD Treats for end of term house points and attendance .
- ◆ End of Term certificates.

Sanctions

- ◆ Pupils made aware of behaviour - staff explain clearly to pupils what they have done.
- ◆ Pupils to receive verbal warning.
- ◆ Pupils to receive written warning on the white board.
- ◆ Time out on 'time out table/chair' - pupils can reflect on their behaviour, attitudes and choices.
- ◆ Red Card issued - class teacher to inform parents.
- ◆ Reflection Time - pupils miss break the following day.
- ◆ Referral to SLT - if a pupil has had a red card twice.
- ◆ Withdrawal from Extended Provision—clubs and rewards which will be reviewed.

The School will work in partnership with parents through out this process.
