

Adderley Food Bank is now open for donations of tinned food only. We will be working with local food bank to ensure our pupils are making a positive contribution to our community.



Our Parents Aims:

Parent Communication Chart

Parents raise any behaviour concerns with the class teacher.



Class teacher to endeavour to resolve any behaviour concerns, queries or information shared by parent accordingly.



If parents are not happy with the outcome it is then progressed to the next level - the Pastoral Team (an appointment made via the school office).



If parents are not happy with the outcome from this meeting they can arrange (via the school office) to meet the relevant SLT for the year group.
