Spring 2: Greenhouse

Creative Curriculum

This half term, children will be taking part in an allotment project at school. They will use their knowledge of plants and their life cycles to write a non-chronological report.

At home, encourage children to look at a wide range of plants around their local area.

RMSE

This term, children will be learning about Good Friday and Easter Sunday and the importance of these events for Christians. Children will be learning about Jesus by experiencing the last supper and exploring its significance.

At home, talk to your child about how Christians celebrate Easter during the holidays.

PSHEC

Children will be exploring the UNICEF Articles: Protection from violence, abuse or neglect and health and health services. Within this topic, they will explore conflict, coping with feelings, and first-aid.

At home, encourage your child to identify and talk about their feelings.

Art

In Art, children will be learning about different botanical artists and developing their skills of sketching and colour matching.

At home children can observe the features of plants around them.

DT

In DT, children will be designing a pneumatic toy following a design brief for a specific age group. They will be researching and evaluating pneumatic and non-pneumatic toys.

At home, identify pneumatic and non-pneumatic toys.



Maths

This term we will be focusing on Fractions, Mass, and Capacity. Children will be able to identify numerators and denominators, find half and quarter of a whole, and shade shapes based on a given fraction. They will also learn to measure and compare mass and capacity, using standard units and everyday contexts.

At home support your child by identify parts of a whole using real-life objects.

Physical Education



This term, 30 will be learning cricket, where they will develop essential skills such as bowling and batting. Children will also learn about fielding, teamwork, and game rules, helping them to build coordination, confidence, and sportsmanship through a range of fun and engaging activities.

At home, encourage children to practise the skills they have learnt in PE lessons.

Music

This term we will review, learn and develop our music knowledge through Pentatonic Melodies and Composition. They will watch the Chinese New Year story of Nian and learn how it is celebrated.

At home children can use purple mash to develop their music skills.

French

This term, children will be learning common classroom instructions, and how to recognise imperative mood through a range of games. They will also learn how to say the names of classroom objects throughout.

At home encourage your children to use different websites to consolidate their learning.



Science

Our topic for this term will be 'Plants'. Children will be exploring parts of a plant. They will be able to identify and describe the functions of different parts of flowering plants. Children will further explore the part that flowers play in the life cycle of flowering plants including pollination, seed formation and seed dispersal.

At home encourage children to look at different plants and identify each part of the plant.

Computing



Children will focus on Computing Systems and Networks: Journey inside a computer. They will be learning about inputs and outputs, computer memory and following instructions on a computer.

At home, allow children to use the computer and explore.

History



This half term, the children will look at different type of greenhouses and their structure also comparing agriculture inside and outside of the UK.

At home, look at structures of greenhouses and study different types of farming.

Homework



Maths, Reading and Topic homework will be set on Thursday on Purple Mash weekly. However, spellings will be given out for the whole half-term to allow extra time to practise. Spelling tests will take place weekly. We encourage all of our parents to let us know how well your child is reading at home. Please regularly write comments in your child's Planner.
